Inspiring Collaborations

Loka has collaborations with inspiring organisations providing unique programmes, sensitive to the school's location and vision. Artreach India is a long standing partner that gives Masterclasses throughout the year, such as: printmaking, Japanese bookmaking and handmade paper art. Art1st provides a 3 year course to mother teachers and senior students to equip them in teaching art as a subject to Loka's smallest ones. Chennai Photo Biennale offers photography workshops and possibilities for students to get their photos published. Shreeja India sends professional sport instructors to Loka who teach football to boost the fitness and confidence of students and enable them to shine in their true potential. Learning at Loka

At Loka children from a remote and rural village receive a complete education of Head, Heart and Hand. Play and activities are at the heart of the learning journey of Loka's smallest ones and until grade 2 all students have caring Mother Teachers. NCERT books form a guideline to Loka's education for middle & senior school students and their teachers are carefully selected to create an atmosphere where children can learn in freedom and discipline. Every child receives one hour 'homework class' a day and can choose between art, poetry, music and dance classes. Workshops and Masterclasses by partner organisations add to the holistic education provided.

Loka students have access to a broad and deep education that is sensitive towards their local situation and approaches each child as a unique being filled with possibilities.

From Education to Entrepreneurship

As Loka's students are growing up, the school is taking a leap into the future by empowering them with useful skills and exploring how they may create their livelihoods and enrich their surroundings.

After grade 8 students leave their formal education at Loka and receive classes elsewhere to prepare for their exams. Part of the day they continue spending at Loka and follow a special programme: From Education to Entrepreneurship. Sanatan (17) manages Loka's farm and is assisted by grade 9 students. He is learning about the transition from conventional to organic farming. Shankar (16) is engaged in an experimental garden where he researches growing plants otherwise not found in the local region, saving seeds and creating a nursery. Dinesh (17), Shilpi (16) and Madhu (16) are setting up a Design Studio where they explore waste issues in their village and find ways to address them, for example by replacing plastic bags with alternatives. Sandeep (16) wants to be an artist and teaches art to younger students, is involved in community art projects and creates beautiful gifts for Loka's guests and supporters. To enhance students' skills and open their minds to new possibilities, every summer internships in organic farming and social entrepreneurship are offered at International Township Auroville (South India). On Loka's campus future plans include a Maker Space, Loka Cafe and Loka (online) Shop. One day this kind of holistic and applied way of learning may transform the village into a small scale sustainable business hub where less people move away to cities in search of work.

Loka's school envisions a future village where people, culture, nature, farming and architecture are in harmony, allowing for a progress that is more conscious than generally is the case.
